COVID-19 coronavirus: Business and industry recovery - WA

Don't send staff to be tested at either COVID clinics or through GP referrals unless they meet testing criteria. Don't send staff to COVID-19 clinics or GPs for medical clearances or certificates. Encourage and practice quality personal hygiene, as you would in the winter flu season — this includes covering coughs and sneezes, washing hands often with soap or sanitiser, and staying away ...
